Providence Classical School Teams with Local Businesses to Host First Fundraiser Since the Acquisition of the East Clinton School Building

I am sure you remember the press last year when special interest groups and private citizens united to save the historic East Clinton School Building from demolition.

Providence Classical School (PCS), a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization and K-12 private school, recently acquired the site and now needs assistance with building renovations and upkeep that is customary with historical structures. To help PCS with their efforts, Nicole Jones Development, CynShea's, and other business leaders are sponsoring, "An Evening of Arts and Architecture: A Benefit to Preserve the East Clinton Building."

The event is a grassroots effort for school officials and parents to introduce themselves to the community as well as to thank the hundreds who supported saving the structure constructed in 1938 by members of the Works Progress Administration (WPA).

Funds raised at An Evening of Arts and Architecture will be held in Providence Classical School's account with the Community Foundation of Huntsville/Madison County for long-term preservation requirements.

For \$20, admission to the event held at the East Clinton Building in downtown Huntsville will include a tour, Art Deco presentation by Architect J. Arnold Von Hagen, dessert, and a theatrical piece performed by the students of Providence Classical School.
